Questions for Study and Reflection

1. Why do you think worship is one of the most important subjects in the Bible?
2. Do you see the hand of God moving upon Glory of Christ, especially around the topic of worship? Why or why not?
3. What does it mean to say that worship encompasses all of life? How does Ephesians 5:18-21 show this to be so?
4. Why is the infinite superiority of God and the infinite inferiority of human beings the basis of worship?
5. Why is the essence of worship both awe and humility?
6. Do you think it's right to say that awe is most often expressed through singing or otherwise praising God and that humility is most often expressed through submission?
7. How is worship like a coin? Like a garden?
8. How does the Holy Spirit make worship possible? Read Ephesians 1-3 to find at least a few of the answers.
9. What does Paul mean by Psalms? By hymns? By spiritual songs?
10. When Paul exhorts us to speak to one another in Psalms, hymns, and spiritual songs, what exactly is he exhorting us to do?
11. What's the difference between socializing and biblical fellowship?
12. What has all of this to do with "being filled with the Spirit"?
13. How does speaking and singing and making melody with our hearts display the fact that we are filled with the Spirit?
14. How does speaking and singing and making melody with our hearts cause us to be filled with the Spirit?
